The District of New Jersey's Local Patent Rules: A Year in Review, and Where We Go From Here

November 15, 2010

This panel discussion, hosted by the Gibbons Institute, featured the Honorable Garrett E. Brown, Jr., Chief Judge, U.S. District Court for the District of New Jersey and the Honorable Tonianne J. Bongiovanni, Federal Magistrate Judge, U.S. District Court for the District of New Jersey. In 2008, Chief Judge Brown appointed a special Local Patent Rules Committee to review and evaluate the need for the creation of separate local rules governing patent cases in the district, one of the most active patent venues in the country. The committee, comprised of district judges, magistrate judges and attorneys, recommended that a standard protocol for patent cases would be useful to the Court, and submitted local patent rules. The new rules took effect on January 1, 2009. Chief Judge Brown and
